After two years of persistence and working through title issues on the 601/619 West High Street property, we officially took ownership of the property this week.

The 24-7 shelter will allow us to provide an environment of hope, love, and grace around the clock. We'll build trusting relationships with our guests and coordinate the necessary resources to help them achieve personal growth, independent living, and permanent housing. Our goal is to open the 24-7 shelter in the fall of 2025. In the meantime, PBOH will continue to operate the Winter Warming Center, offering a warm, safe place to sleep in an atmosphere of hope, love, and grace for Pottstown residents experiencing homelessness.
