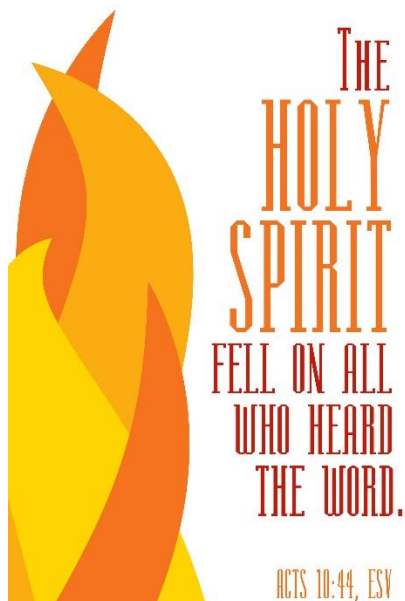
Parking:

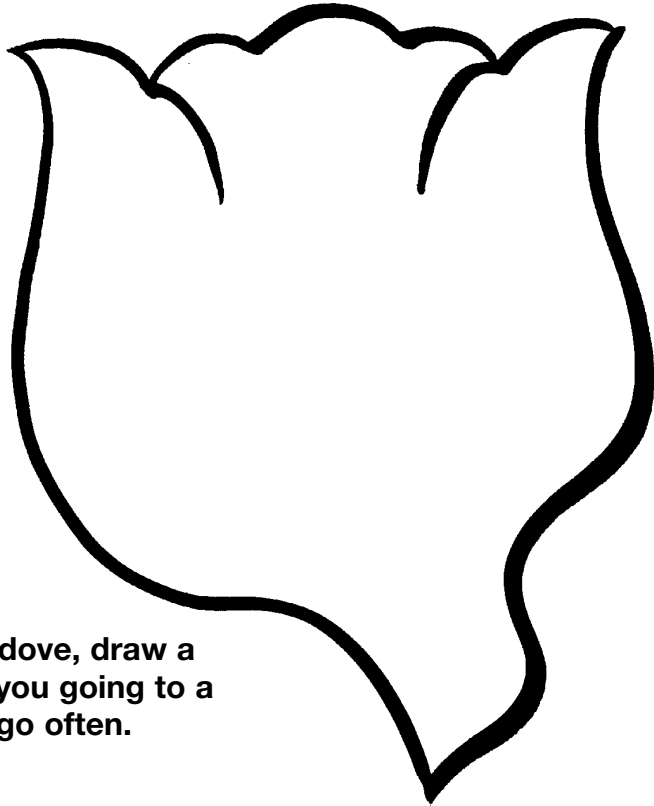
