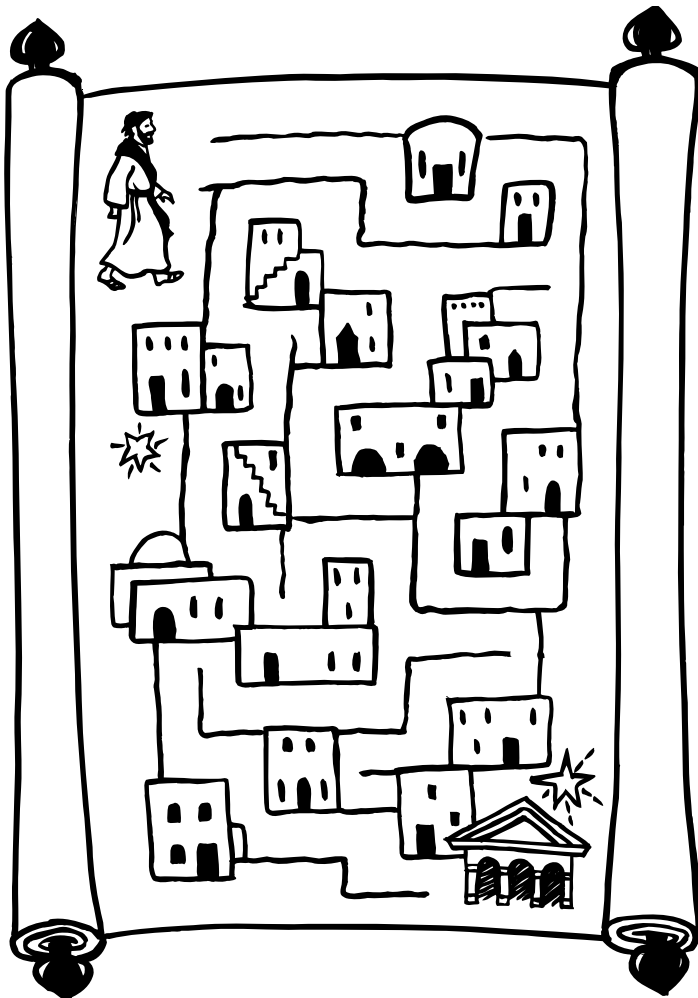


Jesus reads God's word

Luke 4:14-21

Jesus went to the synagogue, his place of worship. He stood up to read God's word. Jesus read, "God's Spirit is with me. God has chosen me to bring good news to people who need love and hope for a better life." Then Jesus said, "Today these words have come true." Jesus meant that he was the one God promised.

God's love is for everyone

God sent Jesus to share the good news with all people around the world.

Here are some ways Christians around the world greet each other and tell about their love for God. Have someone help you pronounce the words.



In parts of South America, Christians greet each other by saying **hermano** (err-MAH-no), which means "brother" in Spanish, and by saying **hermana** (err-MAH-nah), which means "sister." This means that we're all Jesus' brothers and sisters.

Christians in Hong Kong say **ping-an** to greet each other. The word **ping-an** means "peace."



In the country of Tanzania in Africa, people speak Swahili. Here is how they say, "Thank you, Jesus," when they pray:
Asante sana Yesu (a-SAHN-tay SAH-nah YAY-soo).
