
Welcome to worship at New Hanover Lutheran Church




Spreading the good news

Jesus expected the disciples to carry on the work that he had begun. Jesus wanted the world to know that he was God's Son. Jesus prayed that the disciples would work together to spread this good news. One example Jesus had used before to help the disciples understand their job was this one: "I am the vine, you are the branches" (John 15:5).





