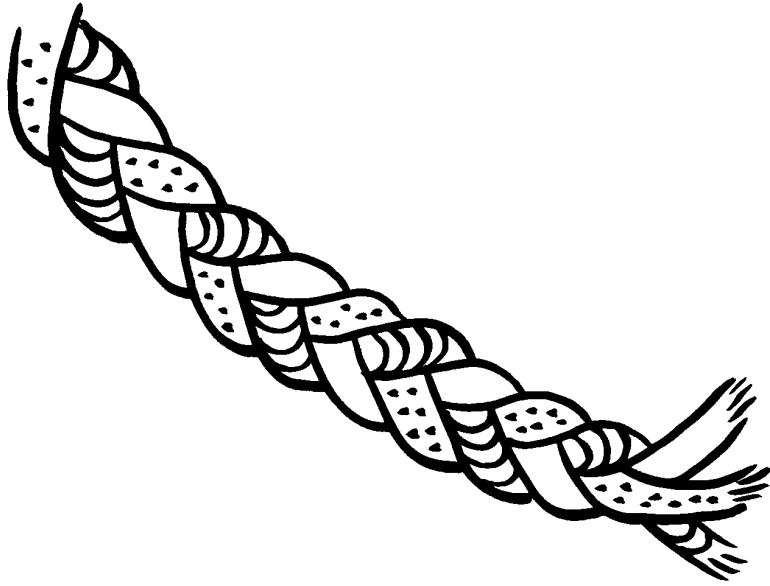

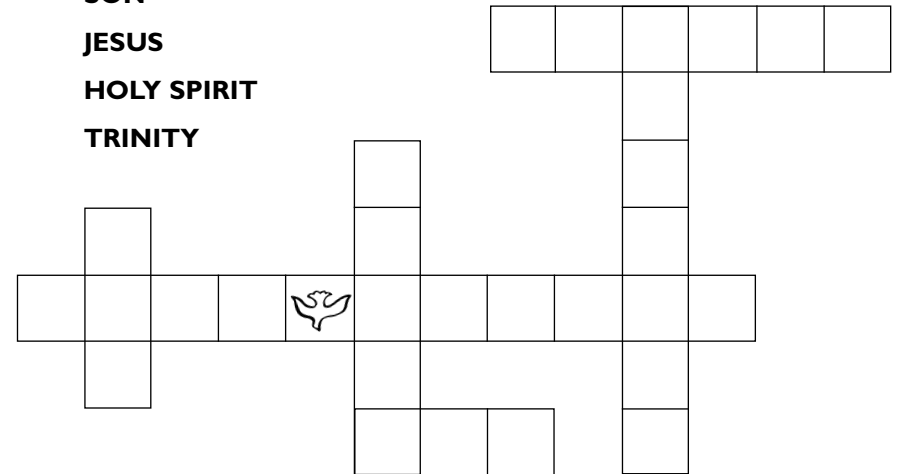

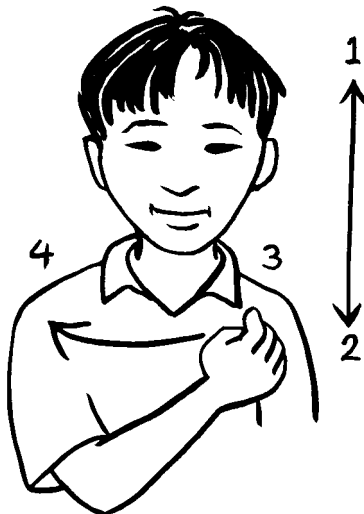


Three names
