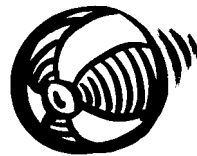
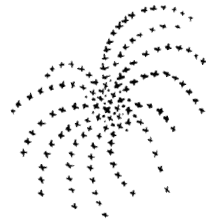
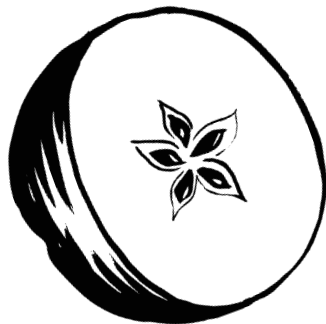


The core of worship
