Mira and her new friend, Kim, had so much in common! They liked to do the same things, and they were going to have the same teacher.

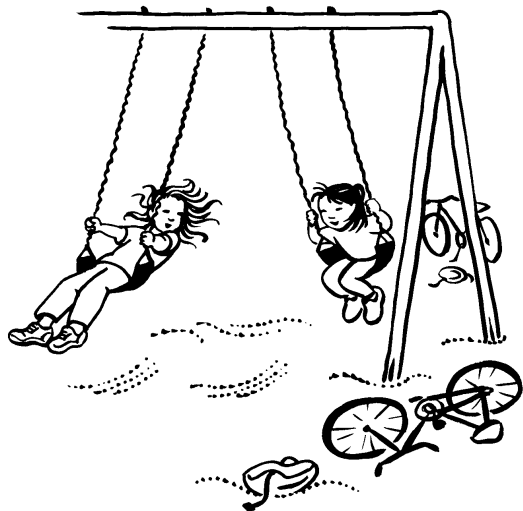
“We will be best friends forever,” said Mira. “Maybe we’re on the same soccer team, too! Do you have practice tomorrow morning?”
