

She always loved music! Although Nancy usually attended the early service, she would frequently worship at the late service on GRACE Sundays in order to hear the praise band. It is our hope that the new drum kit can enhance the musical experience as we praise God through both in-person and online worship. The GRACE sound team is now able to control the drum volume electronically which balances the sound with the other instruments and vocals. We are thankful for the donations that made this possible.





Draw a dove in the sky.

Print "This is my Son" in the puffy cloud shape.

Draw a triangle connecting God's words, the dove, and Jesus.





Dear God, we celebrate being a part of your family. Thank you for your everlasting love. Amen

The triangle is a symbol for the Trinity: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. Listen for that three-part name for God in worship, especially during baptisms.
