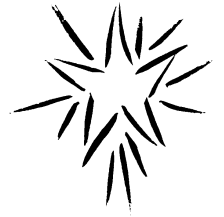

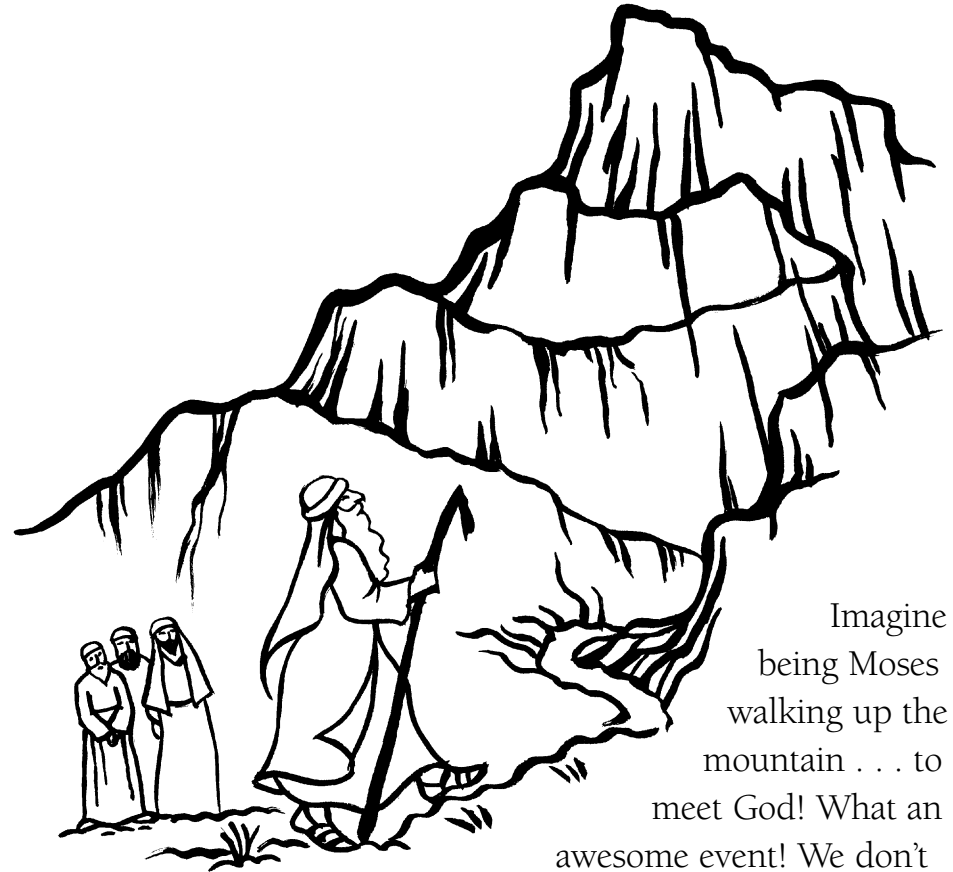
Mountaintop times
