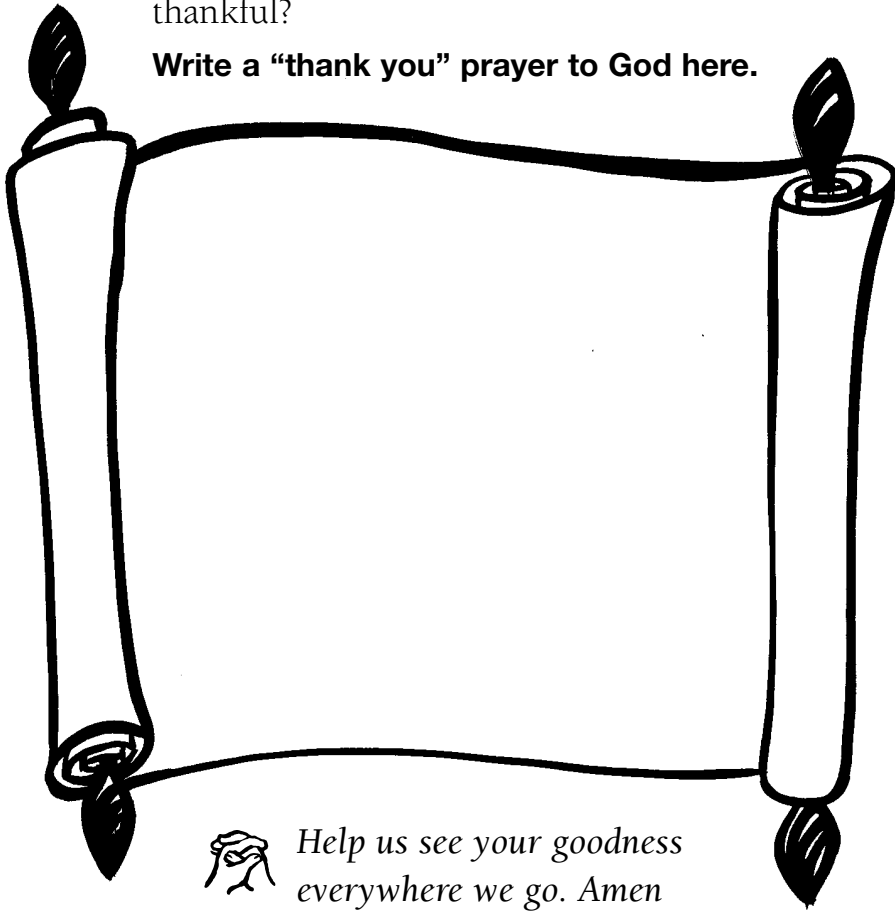

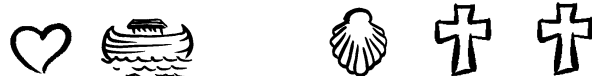
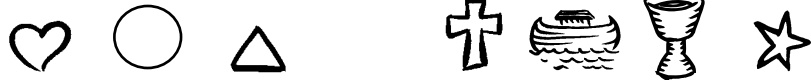













## Finding rest

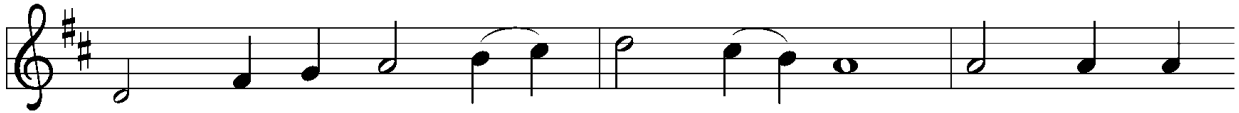

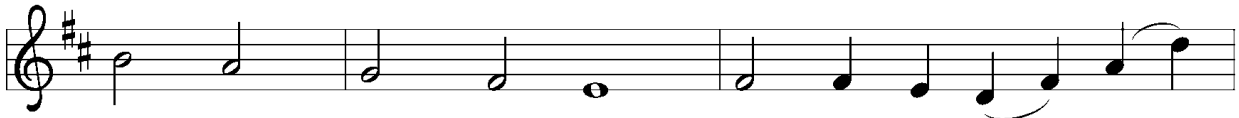
