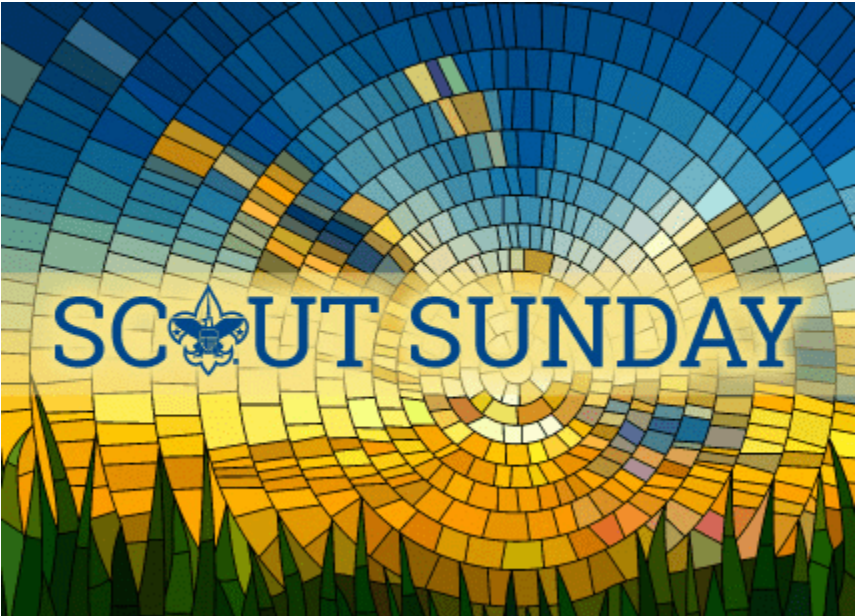

Leader The Scout Law is a guiding light to millions of scouts and young adults throughout the world today, but the principles of the law have been brought to us from ancient days.

You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor.
(Exodus 20:16)

Leader He who is faithful in a very little is faithful also in much; and he who is dishonest in a very little is dishonest also in much. (Luke 16:10)

Scouts **A Scout is loyal.**

Leader You shall not take vengeance or bear any grudge against the sons of your own people, but you shall love your neighbor as yourself. (Leviticus 19:18)
For the poor will never cease out of the land; therefore I command you, You shall open wide your hand to your brother, to thy needy and to the poor, in the land. (Deuteronomy 15:11)

Scouts **A Scout is helpful.**

Leader Love one another with brotherly affection; outdo one another in showing honor. (Romans 12:10)

First Reading A Psalm for Scouts and Scouters

and joyfully live with God forever!

Second Reading 1 Corinthians 8:1-13

A reading from the book of 1 Corinthians

¹Now concerning food sacrificed to idols: we know that “all of us possess knowledge.” Knowledge puffs up, but love builds up.

²Anyone who claims to know something does not yet have the necessary knowledge; ³but anyone who loves God is known by him.

⁴Hence, as to the eating of food offered to idols, we know that “no idol in the world really exists,” and that “there is no God but one.”

⁵Indeed, even though there may be so-called gods in heaven or on earth—as in fact there are many gods and many lords—⁶yet for us there is one God, the Father, from whom are all things and for whom we exist, and one Lord, Jesus Christ, through whom are all things and through whom we exist.

⁷It is not everyone, however, who has this knowledge. Since some have become so accustomed to idols until now, they still think of the food they eat as food offered to an idol; and their conscience, being weak, is defiled. ⁸“Food will not bring us close to God.” We are no worse off if we do not eat, and no better off if we do.

⁹But take care that this liberty of yours does not somehow become a stumbling block to the weak. ¹⁰For if others see you, who possess knowledge, eating in the temple of an idol, might they not, since their conscience is weak, be encouraged to the point of eating food sacrificed to idols? ¹¹So by your knowledge those weak believers for whom Christ died are destroyed. ¹²But when you thus sin against members of your family, and wound their conscience when it is weak, you sin against Christ. ¹³Therefore, if food is a cause of their falling, I will never eat meat, so that I may not cause one of them to fall.

Here ends the reading.

Each year, Pack 367 offers its Scouts an opportunity to earn a Religious Emblem Award as an extension of their Scouting Advancement Program. One of the tenants of the Scout Law is "A Scout is Reverent;" the Religious Emblem Award program reinforces this value. This year they did this together as a family. Today we take time to celebrate Madelyn Artim who has fulfilled the requirements of this special program and deserves recognition for her accomplishment.

The Bible teaches us in Luke chapter 2 that Jesus "grew and became strong, he was full of wisdom, and God's Blessings were upon him." The scout before you today is following the example set by Jesus by seeking to grow in Christian faith and service. The God and Family program is designed to help youth understand the importance of family and God's role in a healthy family. Madelyn Artim has earned the God and Family award and earned the right and privilege of wearing this emblem in recognition of this accomplishment. These awards feature a four colored cross. The four colors converge into a point to create an "X" at the center of the cross. "X" is the first letter in the Greek word for Christ, and it is symbolic of how Christ should be at the center of our lives.

Let us pray: Lord, your Son has called all of us into the adventures of learning and serving. Today we celebrate Madelyn who

answered that call in a special way. We thank you for her and for this moment of celebration. Continue to challenge all of us to grow in Christian service, that your kingdom may become a reality in and through our lives. Amen.

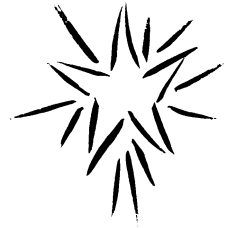




