Two familiar tunes are intertwined in this musical selection. The words of "I Love to Tell the Story" and "Jesus Loves Me," in their simplicity, carry us to the heart of the gospel, the "good news" of the saving grace of Jesus. Katherine Hankey wrote the words to "I Love to Tell the Story" as a poem, in 1866. Her love for her Savior inspired her deep passion for seeing souls saved. Her zeal for telling others about Jesus in word and deed was a driving force in her life. "Jesus Loves Me" was written in 1860 as a poem by Anna B. Warner and included as part of a story meant to comfort the heart of a dying child. The Bible tells us that God loves each and every one of us, despite our sins and faults. This song is meant to comfort and remind us that our Creator is almighty and allloving, and that He is with us each step of the day and will never leave our side. Both of these songs reflect on the gospel message in all its beauty.



The Ferns is totally peer-supported and allows individuals at the respite the time they may need to recover or seek additional treatment.
