Supply Chain of Blessings: Not a problem for God

For the past 20 some months we have witnessed the fragile nature of our supply chain for commercial goods. From electronic chips to toilet paper our nation has experienced shortages. However, there is one item that has not stopped being distributed in abundance.

That item is the Blessings from God. It may sound corny; however, it a true statement when one stops and looks around at what is going on in this community of faith and our neighbors. When one can overlook the availability of new cars or whatever their wants may be, and rather witness the abundance of joy our faith community is delivering through the blessings of God. Then one may see the true abundance of blessings God delivers.

Our food ministry is blessed to have you as volunteers and donors. The ministry has delivered over 70,000 meals to our neighbors who need the support. This past year, recipients of the meals, once healthy and recovered, have become financial donors and volunteer drivers themselves. In total, over 300 different volunteers and donors supported this ministry. I would say that is a blessing.

Our Garden of Hope provided over 16,000 meals through raising crops totaling over 8,000 pounds. The recipients of these blessings witnessed fresh

organic vegetables for the first time and increased their wellness. In all, the two food ministries provided close to 90,000 nutritious meals to battle food scarcity, poverty, and homelessness. The Garden's Harvesting Hope Fair witnessed over 600 attendees in their first year! I would say that is a blessing.

Our Worship teams have quickly reacted and gained proficiency in live streaming and recording our worship videos. Combined with our in-person attendance there are over 200 people attending worship each week. That number is an increase over the attendance before the Covid pandemic. I would say that is a blessing.

While the nation and world are figuring out the supply chain challenge, God has steadily provided abundant blessings upon our faith community. Our challenge of loving our neighbors is being met with the help of God. While one may not get their new car or favorite toy, I know God will provide abundant blessings, that may not be under the Christmas tree or even on their wish list.

What an AMAZING Raise!

Together, we raised \$34,420.50 in October (\$27,292.63 via individual donations at church/ Harvesting Hope Fair/Living Cemetery Tour/Paint Day Fundraiser—\$5,750 online donations—and a bonus gift from the Amazing Raise of \$1,377.87!). Together we held three amazing fundraisers; together we donated monies; together we supported our very special NHELC.

While the majority of the money will be added to the church's general fund, we respect any donors requests and have directed their donations to Peer Support (\$500), Loaves & Fishes (\$2,386), heating oil (\$1,200), Christian Education (\$100), FLUT-TER (\$921), Garden of Hope (\$694), HVAC project (\$100), memorial gift for Jean Boyer (\$50). Donations received at the Living History Cemetery tour will be directed to funding cemetery restoration (\$820).
