### **Disconnect, Connect, Reconnect**

Summer is always an interesting time in the church. While things still go on and one still can connect in worship, making one's offering, growing crops, cooking and delivering food to those in need, children and young adult camps, picnics and social events, most of the community disconnects and connects only in selected activities of the church. This is a truth about the cycle of connecting with God through the church in summer.

However, the cool thing about a "disconnected" summer is that God is present in all places and one can always be connected with God wherever you are. Richard Rohr, a Franciscan Monk and theologian, finds that wherever you are, you are in the presence of God, "God is revealing and loving through everything. That [includes] the creatures, the animals, the elements. The creatures are our brothers and sisters as are the wind, the fire." Yes, even the beach, in the sky, and/or mountain lake is a place where one can be connected with God and worship where you are.

It is a pinnacle of one's Christian" awareness of oneself connection with God and everything that surrounds one, and how one is connected with everything around them. Whether on a beach, lake, or sitting at a little league game, we are never truly disconnected with the body of Christ and God. Rohr, goes on to illuminate connectivity with the holy everywhere in stating, "The height of Christianity is to see God in everything. If we don't see God in everything, we end up seeing God in nothing." Truly, wherever one is, there God is also, and one is with God.

I don't want to ruin the beach moment, so I won't state that "F" word (Fall); however, soon we will Reconnect. Rest assure, when you return, the lights will still be on and yes, the recently installed air conditioners and heating system throughout the entire complex are working.

Reconnecting will have some new initiatives that will enhance being connected to our community wherever you may be. The new sound and video systems will be integrated to provide superior sound in the sanctuary and remote viewing alike

(maybe you are already enjoying worshipping on vacation with us remotely?). Along with the video and sound systems, we will upgrade the electrical network in our historic sanctuary complex to provide a safe and reliable system.




