
Prayer shawls offer comfort

Wouldn't be great to have infinitely more? I would guess, some would say immediately more money, or more time to get things done, and/or to have more free time. So what does infinitely more mean? I believe it depends.

It depends on whether you believe that you can do and have infinitely more with the help of God. It is a faith and trust question between God and us. Our NHELC community has over the past several years began more ministry, took on more mission, and invested more than previous years. However, most likely those who discourage others lack the implementation of our most valuable resources, faith and trust in God. But not you, you are infinitely more faithful and have invested more to make all of this possible.

Hi, this is Joe from Unity Sober Living. Thanks for the meals you've been sending us. I attend Saint Aloysius Church in Pottstown and today's message

was Luke 13:24 "Strive to enter through a narrow gate." I told the boys don't get too fat on the church food or you won't fit through the gate. I think they got the message, try to follow Jesus' way.

As the Apostle Paul implores the Ephesians starting their early church, "Now all glory to God, who is able, through his mighty power at work within us, to accomplish infinitely more than we might ask or think "(Eph 3:20). We have together accomplished infinitely more during this pandemic than others, due to the fact that we had full faith that we could with the power of God at work within us achieve more with God, than doing it ourselves.
