Easter Egg Hunt, a tradition at NHELC

Although Easter eggs were once part of pagan spring festivals, they've become Christian symbols of new life. A cracked-open shell also represents Jesus' empty tomb on Easter morning.







The early Christians of Mesopotamia began staining eggs red in honor of Jesus' blood shed on the cross. Red eggs remain part of Greek Orthodox celebrations today.

In medieval times, churches held "egg-throwing" festivals. The priest threw a hard-boiled egg toward the choir boys, who tossed it back and forth. When the clock struck 12, whoever was holding the egg got to keep it.

The tallest chocolate Easter egg ever produced weighed 16,000 pounds — more than an elephant!

New copier lease agreement brings changes

The NHELC Property Committee will be entering into a new lease agreement for copier services in early May 2023. The new lease agreement has changes which need to be communicated to all committees, boards, and chartered members. NHELC will be reducing the number of copiers from two to one. Reasons for this reduction include:

- Current second copier (Volunteer Office) print totals are less than 10% of the overall print volume;
- Reducing to one copier is a significant cost savings to NHELC (~\$7300 in lease, electric, and paper costs over the five-year lease term)
- Encouraging less use of printed materials is better for the environment.

Starting in early May, all committees, boards, and chartered members requiring printing or copying services may come to the church office and print/copy during normal business hours (9 AM to 2 PM, M-F). You may also email your document(s) to the Office Manager (susan.gutshall@newhanoverlutheran.org) by 12 (noon) on normal business days to have them printed and delivered to a church location where indicated. Documents need to be provided in "print-ready" format - PDF or MS Word. The church office is typically locked outside of normal business hours.

NHELC Capital Campaign Update

Our Capital Campaign will be kicking off this spring! A church capital campaign is a spiritual endeavor which will result in increased giving toward the church vision. Any funds raised are above regular giving and offerings within a set period of time, in NHELC's case, three years. Our campaign will focus on several important projects that will ensure the safety, security and longevity of our historic church. Depending on the funds raised, these projects include the HVAC, audio visual, electrical, lighting, sanctuary flooring, sanctuary exterior work, roof replacement, and organ repairs and enlargement.

We are very excited to announce that an anonymous donor gave \$20,000 towards our completed HVAC project (21% of the outstanding cost) and an additional \$20,000 towards our audio visual, electrical, and lighting project (25% of the anticipated cost). We are so blessed to have received this gift and hope that it encourages others to participate in the campaign as well as we seek to maintain and update our church home.






