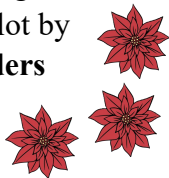


# Christmas Poinsettias

# Food Ministry seeks help

The Food Ministry continues to grow, serving on average 812 meals per week to our neighbors in need. Because of this growth we are identifying ways to expand our kitchen and food distribution capabilities, increase the size of our garden, building relationships with other organizations with similar missions and considering adding a position to assist with the day-to-day logistics. Below are some of the Food Ministry tasks and tasks where we need more help.

1. **Recording meeting minutes** (2<sup>nd</sup> Wednesday each month): About 2.5 hours per month. This person would NOT need to be part of the committee.
2. **Searching and applying for grants:** Computer skills and some perseverance will be required. Time commitment varies.
3. **Logistics** (multiple opportunities): Assist with day-to-day food acquisition, kitchen maintenance coordination, tracking expenses, and more. 8 – 10 hours per week.
4. **Volunteer coordination:** Assist with the scheduling of volunteers and tasks. Time commitments:  
**Garden:** varies by season (see #6)  
**Kitchen:** 1 – 2 hours per week
5. **Volunteer time for food preparation** (assist Chef Chris): 4 – 6 hours per week.
6. **Volunteer time in the garden** (seasonal – garden prep, planting, watering, weeding, harvesting, prep for winter): Provide whatever time you can.
7. **Volunteer for food delivery:** About 1 hour per week.
8. **Join our vibrant committee and help lead our growth and direction:** Time commitment varies based on role and assigned tasks. Two hours minimum for monthly meeting.

# Council Corner

- The Council agreed and approved covering Nikki Young's seminary candidacy application fee (\$1,300). The Council is supportive of Nikki's desire to begin her path toward becoming an ordained person in the Lutheran church!
- The Council, on behalf of the Congregation, extends a sincere "Thank You" to all of the staff at NHEL C for their dedication and services to our ministries.
- The Council and Food Ministry board express a "Thank You" to Jim Davidheiser for his temporary chef responsibilities for our Loaves & Fishes ministry while Chef Chris Fatzinger is on medical leave for six-eight weeks recovering from recent surgery. Please pray for a speedy recovery for Chris!
- The 2024 Annual Budget planning process is underway. Any/all committees should be considering their needs for 2024, and all boards should be preparing their 2024 budgets. Please work with the Finance Committee representation in providing the necessary information to complete the budget.
- The Council has been working with the Constitution Committee throughout 2023 on amendments suggested by the ELCA. Information on the changes and ratification process will be coming soon from the Constitution Committee.
- The Council approved the fee necessary (\$1,500) to request a township zoning variance for an NHEL C Family Center (pre-school) to operate on church property. Further approvals required from Council regarding the Family Center will be determined once more details are provided.
- The Council continues working on reducing expenses to the General Fund:
  - \* Pastor's health insurance savings (due to Pastor's decisions) - savings will be \$3,078.42 for 2023 and will be \$12,313.68 for 2024. This will be recurring savings for future years;
  - \* Property/Liability insurance review and change by Property Committee saving more than \$5,000 annually with added benefits;
  - \* Video/audio production cost reduction given the new system is up and running with more volunteers;
  - \* Endowment Committee recommendation with Council approval (4% of total Endowment Fund amount annually will provide future contributions to the General Fund;
  - \* Jim Davidheiser volunteering (Thank you Jim!!) during Chef Chris' medical leave saving Food Ministry between \$4,700 - \$6,300 in 2023 (dependent on Chris' recovery and return).

# Mental Health and Wellness

Millions of people across the nation are affected by mental health conditions. In 2021, about one in five adults in the United States experienced mental illness (NAMI.org). Understanding mental health is important to individuals to access appropriate services to provide treatment as needed. Mental health conditions have an impact on individuals physically, socially, and financially.

NHELC has provided Peer Support Ministry access over the past few years supported through grant money and donations. The support ministry has gone through some changes. Currently the ministry is pursuing some partnerships in the community for outreach to those seeking assistance with mental health issues both immediate and long-term. Organizations such as the National Alliance on Mental Health (NAMI) offer a help line and crisis center and the National Institute on Mental Health (NIMH) offers educational resources and assistance. Pennsylvania offers a 24-hour addiction line and suicide help. The people manning these lines are individuals trained in crisis management. The numbers will be added to the church website and links to both NAMI, the National Institute for Mental Health, and the PA addiction line in the future.

What can you do for yourself in these times when you feel pressured, saddened? Take time to check out the websites for the organizations mentioned above and the resources they have to offer.

NAMI has local centers in both Reading and Lansdale. They offer in-person and online support groups.
