

And, don't forget to wear something red on Pentecost Sunday.



### Pastor's Message

It's hard to carry the cross, with the world on your shoulders!

"Come to me, all you that are weary and are carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me; for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light." (Matthew 11:28-30)

It's crazy to think we can live a life as Jesus lived when we try to hold the world on our shoulders. One of our recent gospel readings encouraged us to pick up the cross and follow me! It's hard to stoop over to pick up anything when you are carrying the load of the world on your shoulders. That can only happen when we drop the world so to speak and focus on the things that matter in life to make this world, our nation, our community, our families, ourselves better.

I mean it was one short month ago the world was totally focused on the romance of a billionaire performer and arguably an ok tight end in football (OK, I am an Eagles Fan). Seriously! When we let stuff like that into our lives, the world has just gotten heavier, and the cross is further from our reach. And don't get me started on performers and athletes renegotiating their \$400 million plus contracts! I mean if anyone wants to reach out and ask them to join our church, and speak monthly, well, then maybe it's ok.

Politics, don't get me started about the swamp, there has been no lack of sexual abuse, slavery and all kinds of abuse and thievery in the halls of our political offices and courts, including the white house since the beginning of our country, and yet we squabble over the constitution. We argue over state and national rights when our neighbors are suffering. No wonder Jesus remarks give unto Caesar what is Caesars. Even Jesus knew better. The political swamp like our swamp next to church never drains! Come on! And just when we thought we had enough of the royal family, they are back in the news. Alleged photo shopped photos? Who cares and who has the time to compare the lighting and the patterns on the shorts of the children around their mother to see if it's real. For all those people, here is some clear accurate non-altered advice, "Who cares?" The royal family are people, and I love them as Gods creation, however, whether they are faking photos, who cares. Like our swamp, they are not going away. Pass the caviar.

The world you see just gets heavier. I often wondered how Jesus spent three years wandering around in a small country, and why Rome the cruel oppressors didn't care about thousands of people traveling across the country? They obviously didn't see him as a threat. And then I had this, Epiphany (OK, its Lent at publication). It is simple, Jesus wasn't taking their money, he wasn't running for office, he wasn't doing anything to stop the corrupt Roman world. He wasn't interested in the swamp of Rome; he was travelling along with his hoard to save Gods people. It was like a Jesus-Palozza tour.

Along the way, he touched people's lives by healing them, feeding them, loving them. Telling them who had ears to listen, and even if they didn't, he gave them hearing; however, he told them of a wonderful world, a different world awaiting them. He told them about a God that loved them so much that God didn't want their money, their curtsey, their bodies, God just wanted them to know that they were loved.

When we embrace this essence of Christianity, that God loves us freely, we have what Martin Luther called "The Freedom of a Christian." Meaning that when we, like the people waving frantically their palms and realizing that the Messiah has come for our salvation, we recognize that the world has less to offer than God. When we realize we have nothing to owe this world, and we have nothing to do to earn Gods love and forgiveness, then, and only then can we shed the world and pick up the cross.

The cross meaning, our ability to love others. The ability to give to others that need it. Without the world on our shoulders, we can build ministries

### Life and light

Easter is the assurance that no matter how hopeless and dark things appear, God is alive and actively working. Our heavenly Father births life out of death, transforms brokenness into wholeness and shines light into darkness.



### Who me? Yes you!

The Bible is filled with people who don't feel up to the challenge of serving God, speaking for God or leading God's people. But God always knows what God's doing. Pastor Haviland Houston issues this challenge: "When you are hesitant to act, or feel a failure of nerve coming on, when courage lags, or even if laziness and the 'I don't care' blues get you down, may the words of Mordecai to Esther burn in your hearts and minds: 'And who knows whether you have not come to the kingdom for such a time as this?"" (See Esther 4:14.)

Max Lucado offers a similar reminder in *You Were Made for This Moment.* "God always has a person," he writes, also citing the book of Esther.

#### "When we feel as though everything is falling apart, God is working in our midst, causing everything to fall into place. God is the King of quiet providence, and God invites you and me to partner with God in God's work."

Lucado continues: "[God] has a Joseph for every famine and a David for every Goliath. When God's people need rescuing, God calls a Rahab into service. When a baby Moses needs a mama, God prompts an Egyptian princess to have compassion. God always has a person. God had someone in the story of Esther. And in your story God has you."
