
Can you help

We are thrilled to share the news we've all been waiting for-Pottstown Beacon of Hope can now start the building process for our 24-7 shelter! After two years of persistence and working through title issues on the 601/619 West High Street property, we officially took ownership of the property this week.

Your support over the past two years has been invaluable. During the prolonged title situation, our volunteers and donors gave us the energy and determination to keep pushing forward.

The 24-7 shelter will allow us to provide an environment of hope, love, and grace around the clock. We'll build trusting relationships with our guests and coordinate the necessary resources to help them achieve personal growth, independent living, and permanent housing. Our goal is to open the 24-7

shelter in the fall of 2025. In the meantime, PBOH will continue to operate the Winter Warming Center, offering a warm, safe place to sleep in an atmosphere of hope, love, and grace for Pottstown residents experiencing homelessness.

Thank you again for your unwavering support. We ask for your continued prayers and support as we move toward making the PBOGH 24-7 shelter a reality.

Council Corner

The following list highlights the Council meeting on Thursday, July 18th.

- The results from the Sunday, July 14th, Special Congregational Meeting were 71 total votes: 61 yes votes, 10 no votes. This action gives the Council permission to approve expenditures for the NHELC Learning Center planning process and feasibility study continuation above the constitutionally imposed limit of 3% of the 2024 annual budget total. The amount for this approval has been capped at \$50,000 above the 3% limit.
- Thank you to Jim Davidheiser for acting as our Food Ministry Chef during Chris Fatzinger's medical leave.

- ♣ Garden of Hope expansion is underway, please walk/drive back to the garden to see the progress.
- If you unlock a door for church access, lock the door behind you. Doors have been left open causing a security risk.
- ☆ Giving/offering envelopes if you do not need offering envelopes please see Scott Geiser or Susan Gutshall (Simply Giving, other electronic giving).
- Space utilization please let Susan Gutshall know if you are planning to use any church space for events and meetings.

here in the cemetery next to the church.
