
Youth learn about homelessness

Council Corner





The following items were discussed at the February 20th Council meeting.



- Finance continues to monitor the 2025 Annual Budget against actuals. Currently we are running a total deficit YTD as of January 31 of \$13,500. Total income at the end of January (8.3% of the year) was at 7.9% and expenses were at 8.3%.
- The recently approved 2025 General Fund budget is a *deficit* budget of ~\$60,000. In order to eliminate the deficit, provide for timely benevolence payments, continue programs and maintain our staff, the Council is strongly encouraging each giving unit to increase giving to the extent possible by 20%. On average across all giving units this equates to \$7/week, \$30 a month, or \$361/year. Please consider your giving in 2025. The Council has committed to giving increases by a majority of its members.
- The 2025 Council will have eight Councilmembers out of twelve expected positions. Council members may be appointed by the standing Council at any time of the year to 1, 2 or 3 year terms. If you have interest in serving as a Councilmember please talk to any current Councilmember.

- The Council has approved the creation of a new standing board the Learning Center Board. This board will have oversight of the operations of the Learning Center and report to the Council. The new board will organize, finalize the job description, and begin the Learning Center initiation process immediately.

Pastor's Message I – We







I know right away, some will say, oh my, here we go again with pronouns. However, I believe we need to hear these pronouns because we use them everyday and they are important in the daily language of a Christian, and the world for that matter. And you may ask, why?

Everything begins with I. I was created by God in God's image, and I am a beautiful child of God. If we begin our day believing this statement, then I believe it makes ourselves and the world a better place. One small contribution to the things we can change contributes to the good of all. "I" then moves towards "We."

So why do we need the pronoun "We"? Well the word Christian itself is defined as a "Follower of Christ." There are of course many other interpretations however this is the base meaning and thus there are least two of you if you profess to be a Christian (Jesus and You). Then there is the meaning of Christianity as the Body of Christ. One body, many parts equals "We."

Thus We, is a good term to use when describing who a Christian is, as there is always two or more. So I like the use of the pronouns, I and We. For they describe what I am, what the church is and what the world is all about. We are One body, with many parts.

Those many parts make the "We", and as Christians we are directed to loved one another by Christ. So while we believe different things about a lot of things, We are in this thing called Christianity together. And together, with the help of God, We can do immeasurably more than we could conceivably imagine doing by ourselves (Ephesians 3:20), I believe.

The year may witness many changes in the world and our community; however, together we can still bring Christ's love to those who need it. It may require doing things different. However, it all starts with the changes we make with "I" and "We."


