

Council Corner



Here are highlights from the January 15th Council meeting.

- Finance is closing out the 2025 Annual Budget against actuals. Due to the early Council meeting in January the Finance Committee has not fully completed the 2025 year-end financials. Year-end 2025 financials will be reviewed and discussed at the February Council meeting.
- The approved 2026 General Fund budget is a **deficit** budget of ~\$90,000. The deficit will vary depending on the timing of a new Senior Pastor and the compensation package. In order to eliminate the deficit, provide for timely benevolence payments, continue programs, and maintain our staff the Council is strongly encouraging each giving unit to increase giving to the extent possible by 20%. On average across all giving units this equates to \$7/week, \$30/month, or \$361/year. Please consider your giving in 2026. Thank you for your continued support!
- The Council will hold a "Coffee with the Council" open informational session on March 22nd immediately following the 9AM worship service in the Fellowship Hall. NHELCC has a lot of activity and projects moving forward in 2026 and the Council would like to continue sharing information, listen to feedback, and answer questions. Plan to grab a cup of coffee and join the conversation.
- The Council approved a compensation package for Nikki Young starting January 1, 2026 (as part of the 2026 Proposed Budget). Nikki will be our Vicar and part-time Director of Children, Youth, and Family Ministry until a Senior pastor is called. We are blessed to have Nikki as part of our transition between Senior Pastors to help maintain continuity of our worship and ministries.
- The Synod has assigned Vice-Pastor Mark Singh-Hueter from Advent Lutheran in Harleysville to NHELCC. Pastor Mark will support Vicar Nikki on an as needed basis. Pastor Mark will also oversee Nikki's Internship as part of her seminary journey.
- The Transition Committee has completed and submitted the NHELCC Ministry Site Profile to the Synod, which now opens us up to receive candidates for the Senior Pastor role.
- The Property Committee is overseeing a HVAC project to replace the 35-year-old air-conditioning system that services the Sanctuary and Fellowship Hall. The total cost is estimat-

ed at \$80,000. The Capital Campaign funds will partially cover the expense. Watch for a campaign announcement to request additional capital funds for this much-needed project.

- The Council approved an organ remediation project (the organ is 40 years old this year!). All funds to support this project are being provided in a directed manner by an anonymous donor.
- Councilmember nomination cycle for the 2026 Council are now open. If you have an interest in serving as a Councilmember please talk to any current Councilmember for information. The due date for nominations is February 19. The current 2025 Council has nine Councilmembers out of twelve expected positions.
- All meeting and event requests by committees, members or non-members are to be communi-

cated to the Church Office Manager. Susan Gutshall, NHELCO office manager, manages the master calendar for all activity and facility use to support minimizing conflicts. Committees and boards - please be sure to notify Susan of all activities planned at the church. This is especially important during the Sunshine Learning Center renovation process.

- If you unlock a door for church access, lock the door behind you. Doors have been left open causing a security risk.
- Giving/offering envelopes - if you do not need offering envelopes please see Scott Geiser or Susan Gutshall (Simply Giving, other electronic giving).

The next Council meeting (open to all members) is scheduled for February 19, 2026 at 6:30 PM.



When life gets out of control

In September 2024, a North Dakota teen's car malfunctioned, becoming unstoppable and reaching 113 miles per hour. For 40 minutes, 18-year-old Sam navigated a bridge into Minnesota, intersections with train tracks and highways, small towns and — almost — the road's dead end.

But after Sam called his mom and 911, multiple first responders gathered. Police drove near him, staying on the phone and calmly asking about the accelerator, emergency brake and remaining gas. Ambulance crews were ready. The highway patrol laid speed sticks to puncture the tires (it didn't work) and cleared intersections ahead of the runaway vehicle. All the while, Sam's mom prayed. Finally, an officer sped ahead so Sam could run into his squad car, bringing his own to a halt.

Not making light of what could have turned tragic,

sometimes our lives get out of control too. We speed through work, school, relationships, parenting — trying to accomplish, achieve and gain faster than others. We cram as much in each day as possible, seemingly unable to slow down. The harried pace can endanger our physical, mental and spiritual health.

Often, we're "saved" only as people who care come alongside us to help. Perhaps family members express concern, professionals suggest remedies, loved ones pray for us. Finally, when all we can do is crash into the loving care of God, we come to rest. It may take time to recover emotionally, to dare get back "behind the wheel," to trust life to carry us at a safe speed again. But thanks be to God for placing support systems around us when we need them most.

In Romans 15:7, Paul writes, “Accept one another, then, just as Christ accepted you, in order to bring praise to God.”


By this belief, we are committed to intentionally following Jesus’ example of unconditional hospi-



Dear New Hanover Lutheran Church Members,

Thank you for considering New Hanover Sunshine Learning Center for your child's early education. We are so happy to announce that Grace Early Learning Center will be relocating to Sunshine Learning Center for the upcoming 2026/2027 school year. The current staff at GELC look forward to continuing to offer the same high-quality program that we have offered in our Pottstown location.

Some highlights of our program are working to develop the whole child through academics, socialization, gross and fine motor activities, spiritual and exploration activities using the PA Early Learning Standards. We welcome parent involvement through school wide activities and classroom activities. Sunshine Learning Center will offer gym and music classes once a month included in the tuition price. All our staff will be moving from a PA Keystone Star 4 center offering our children the highest quality of care and staff in PA.

We will continue to offer care for children ages 1-5. Part-time classes will be available for 1 yr.-3 yr. classes during the hours of 9:00-11:30. PreK classes will be offered from 9:00AM-12:00PM, MWF or Monday-Friday. All age groups will also be offered a Mon./Wed./Fri. option or Monday-Friday from 9:00AM- 3:00PM. Each class can also be a three day or five-day full-time option. Our school is open from 6:30 AM-5:00 PM. For the convenience of our families, snacks are included for all morning and full day programs at the early learning center. Lunch is also available for our 9-3 and full day students provided by Kremmer's Food Service.

Enrollment is open until all spots are filled. This year all reregistration for current students will be done online. The registration is **\$65.00** for the first child, and **\$30.00** for the second child. **The registration fee is non-refundable.** Please complete registration and payment for your child online as soon as possible to secure the class days and times that are needed for your child. If you are doing 5 half days, it will be necessary to select both M/W/F and T/H as the registration option.

Registration will open early on Feb. 3rd to our New Hanover Lutheran Church families for the Fall of 2026 enrollment. Registration will open to the public on Feb. 15th. All student health forms need to be filed by **August 25, 2026.** **Please note your child cannot attend school without a health form on file.** If you have your child's health form completed at the time of registration, a new health form will be needed 1 year from the date of completion.
